## Our 60<sup>th</sup> Birthday – 2012

A public meeting was held in the Memorial Hall on the 29<sup>th</sup> of August, 1950 with the object of forming a Bowling Club in Woodford.

The first General Meeting was held on the 24<sup>th</sup> of October, 1950 and the first Committee elected. On the 28<sup>th</sup> of June, 1951 a meeting was called with the intention of forming a Woodford & District Ladies Bowling Club. The Ladies Club was officially opened in 1952 by Mrs. Ducat, the reigning President of the C.L.B.A. The entrance fee was One Pound One Shilling and at first play commenced using two rinks on the 29<sup>th</sup> of November, 1952.

In 1966 a proposal was put forward to build a new Clubhouse and many functions were held to raise funds, including, "The First Bowlers Ball". The original Clubhouse was on the opposite side of the Green to where the present Clubhouse now stands. The present Clubhouse was opened in 1975 and the lighting of the green for night bowls was officially opened on the 1<sup>st</sup> of December, 1989.

In 2012 we will celebrate our 60<sup>th</sup> Birthday, throughout the year we will be partying – back to the 50's – Ladies, hope you've kept your frocks. The main highlight of the year will be a Ball
