Law 23: The minimum length end in Australia is now 21 metres.

Law 18.2.4: If the toss is before trial ends. The winner of the toss has the option of giving the mat away or keeping it. This applies to the first trial end and the first end of the match.

### Work Your Mind Answers

**Q1** Exactly how many minutes is it before seven o'clock, if 40 minutes ago it was three times as many minutes past two o'clock?

**Q1 Answer:** 65 minutes.

There are 300 minutes between 2:00 and 7:00. We can ignore the "40 minutes ago" for a little while and share the remaining 260 minutes in the ratio 3:1, which is 195:65. Which means the 5 hours between 2:00 and 7:00 are made of up 195 minutes + 40 minutes + 65 minutes. Which means it is currently 65 minutes before 7:00. So it is now 5:55 (65 minutes before 7:00).

To double check, 40 minutes ago it was 5:15 - which is 195 minutes after 2:00, as required (as  $65 \times 3 = 195$ ).

---

**Q2** Practical Peter was asked to cut a 99 foot rope into three smaller, equal length ropes. However, as usual, Pete couldn't find his measuring tape so he guessed! When he finally did find his tape (it was under his hat), he discovered that the second piece of rope was twice as long as the first piece minus 35 feet. The third piece of rope was half the length of the first, plus 15 feet. How long were each of the pieces of rope?

**Q2 Answer:** First = 34 feet. Second = 33 feet. Third = 32 feet.

This question can be solved easily using algebra, if we call the length of the first rope A, we have:

Rope 1 = A; Rope 2 =  $2 \times A - 35$ ; Rope 3 =  $1 \div 2 \times A + 15$ .

The three ropes add to 99 feet, so:  $99 = \text{Rope 1} + \text{Rope 2} + \text{Rope 3}$

$$99 = A + (2 \times A - 35) + 1 \div 2 \times A + 15$$

$$99 = 3.5 \times A - 20$$

Adding 20 to both sides we have:

$$119 = 3.5 \times A$$

So:  $A = 119 \div 3.5$

$$A = \text{Rope 1} = 34 \text{ feet}$$

$$\text{Rope 2} = 2 \times 34 - 35 = 68 - 35 = 33 \text{ feet}$$

$$\text{Rope 3} = 1 \div 2 \times A + 15 = 1 \div 2 \times 34 + 15 = 17 + 15 = 32 \text{ feet}$$
