### Men's Section

We will host the District Fours on Saturday July 2<sup>nd</sup>, there are four games in the morning starting at 9.00 a.m. and four games in the afternoon. The same format will apply to the upcoming trial Saturday June 11. **Important**, to help the selectors prepare for the day and to help with catering please put your name on the game sheets provided. A reminder about a few of the law changes early this year;

**Law 18.4 Giving the mat away** : The winner of the toss of the coin has the option of keeping or giving the mat away in only the first end and any extra end. The winner of all following ends must keep the mat.

**Law 37.1.8 Skips Duties** : Skips between them to keep the scorecard and scoreboard where a scoreboard attendant is not available.

**Law 37.1.9 Skips Duties** : The skip cannot delegate the duty of keeping the card/scoreboard.

**Law 36.1.2. Position of players at the head not controlling play** : If they are members of the team in possession of the rink, behind the jack. If they are members of the team not in possession of the rink, they should stand behind the jack and away from the head.



### Games for All


